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General Information: The Muhlenberg County 4-H Council will make available \$2,000 in scholarships to be awarded to outstanding 4-H members in Muhlenberg County annually, \$1,000 to the top candidate and the remaining \$1,000 distributed among other qualifying applicants.

The 4-H Council will pay the scholarship fund directly to the applicant under the following conditions: 1. Proof of enrollment at an accredited institute of higher learning. 2. Applicants will submit an invoice for expenses and be reimbursed upon approval of qualified expenses, up to the scholarship amount.

The 4-H Council reserves the right to make the final decision on all cases that may arise concerning the interpretation of these rules.

Applicants must be an active 4-H member in good standing who will finish high school by July 1 of current year. Students must finish high school in the year that they apply for the scholarship.

Applications must be received by the 4-H Council on or before May 1 at 3690 State Route 1380 Central City, KY 42330.

Scholarship recipients will be recognized at the school awards day ceremony.

Recipients must enter school not later than the fall semester of the year applied in, unless circumstances beyond their control occur, such as serious illness or injury, preventing them to attend.

If suitable candidates do not apply, any or all of the scholarship funds may not be awarded.

Applicants are judged on the following: (All responses should be typed.)

- 4-H Involvement-25%
- 4-H Accomplishments-15%
- 4-H Leadership-20%
- 4-H Community Service-25%
- 4-H Essay-15%

Application should include one letter of recommendation from teacher or community leader aware of your qualifications (not an Extension employee.)

Application should include a copy of high school transcript.





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Applications should be arranged in the following order:

- Cover page with billfold size photo
- 4-H Involvement
- 4-H Accomplishments
- 4-H Leadership
- 4-H Community Service
- 4-H Essay
- Letter of recommendation
- High school transcript

(Applicants should break down responses by year. Think clubs, projects, activities, events, trips, etc. Think local, county, district, state, national. Prepare responses in a format easy for judges to review.)

Respond to each of the following on a separate page, typed.

Respond to A, B, C, & D by year. Indicate involvement on local, state, area, and national level.

- A. 4-H Involvement: Share with us your involvement in 4-H from your early years to current.
- B. 4-H Accomplishments: Share with us your successes/achievements in 4-H.
- C. 4-H Leadership: Share with us the leadership roles you've assumed through 4-H.
- D. 4-H Community Service: Share with us the community service projects you've assisted with and your role with each.
- E. Attach one letter of recommendation from teacher or community leader (outside of 4-H.)
- F. Essay: Share with us how 4-H has helped prepare you to be a productive, contributing member of society.
- G. Provide a copy of your high school transcript.
