Frost seeding can begin in early February. Red and white clover are the two legumes that we typically frost seed. To learn more about frost seeding, go to www.ca.uky.edu and type in *AGR 271 Frost Seeding Clover: A Recipe for Success* in the search area.

Topdressing cool season grass hay fields with up to 60 actual pounds of nitrogen can begin as early as February 15. Research has proven that applying nitrogen in the February 15 to March 15 window allows for any nitrogen source to be utilized without volatilization/loss of nitrogen.
